

Humans do not really have a fur, just some patches of hair in a few very strangely located parts on their body: on the top of their head, under their armpits, over the eyes, on their genitals,...The length of these hair varies a lot depending on the location of the patch (for example on the head they keep growing longer and longer, but over the eyes it is just a thin line of short hairs).

The rest of the human body is covered by a very thin and fragile skin, that gets wet when they sweat.

The particularity of this skin is that it is „naked“. This word is only used for humans, even though a lot of other animals have no fur, but somehow they don't suffer from it. Humans are naked, because their skin needs protection, it needs another layer of something to keep them warm, and shield them against their environment.

To solve this problem, they borrow the skin of dead animals, or they steal the fur of living animals, like sheeps, goats or rabbits.

They also use vegetal materials to keep themselves warm, like for example the natural fiber of the cotton plant. Out of these fibres, and out of the fur of the dead animals, they make threads that they interlace together to build a warm second skin that has the exact shape of their body.

Somehow humans like to arrange and decorate their own body with other materials, not only because they feel cold, but also for other various reasons. For example they build little objects which they attach around some of their body parts, very often these objects are in the form of a ring that circles around their wrists, their ankles, their necks, or their fingers. Some humans pierce a hole in their earlobes to be able to hang one of these rings there.

It is not very clear what the purpose of these objects is, no other animal does that, but maybe some plants do, moss covers some trees like a second skin, circles around them and builds a ring around them.

Once I saw two humans wearing a ring of moss on their wrist, it was a mother and a child. The moss was resting on their skin, keeping them warm, shining a bright green.

The moss was alive on their skin, what was the communication happening between the moss and the mother and the child, I would be curious to know.
